Junior Corner - What is a Shiner?

Many fisherman like to fish with Shiners. You can buy them in most stores and bait shops. Most of the time they are in a jar you can put in your tackle box, but bait shops also sell them as live bait. So what *is*a Shiner?

A Shiner is a small species of fish that is Cyprinid family of fish. These fish are usually only about four to six inches long when full grown and are a shiny silver in color. Some shiners can also be golden.

Shiner are best used for Bass fishing. Largemouth and Smallmouth Bass are attracted to them. If you fish in shallow waters, just use a regular hook and a shiner. In deeper water use a baitholder or circle hook and some extra weight to get the bait down to where the fish are.
